Executive Summary

Since 1982, tips coming in over the Crime Stoppers hotline in Tarrant County have resulted in excess of **\$2,559,800** in rewards being paid to anonymous tipsters. These tips resulted in the recovery of over **\$33,975,190** worth of stolen property and narcotics, over **12,949** law breaking individuals being arrested, and over **30,906** cases being cleared.

The Safe City Commission Crime Stoppers Program has two operational divisions. Collectively, in 2013 these divisions paid **\$88,955** in rewards. These rewards helped effect the recovery of **\$554,780** in stolen property and narcotics, the arrest of **319** individuals, and the clearing of **661** cases.

The Community Program – 2013

Countywide, Crime Stoppers assisted in the recovery of stolen property and narcotics valued at **\$552,491**. In addition, **251** arrests were made, **485** cases were cleared, and **\$81,425** in rewards was paid in 2013.

The Campus Program - 2013

Rewards for the Campus Crime Stoppers Program totaled **\$7,530**, with **\$2,289** in stolen property and narcotics being recovered, **68** individuals arrested, **88** administratively disciplined, and **176** cases cleared on Tarrant County middle and high school campuses.

The program aims at breaking down a code of silence that often exists among gangs and people who witness gang-related or gun-related crimes.

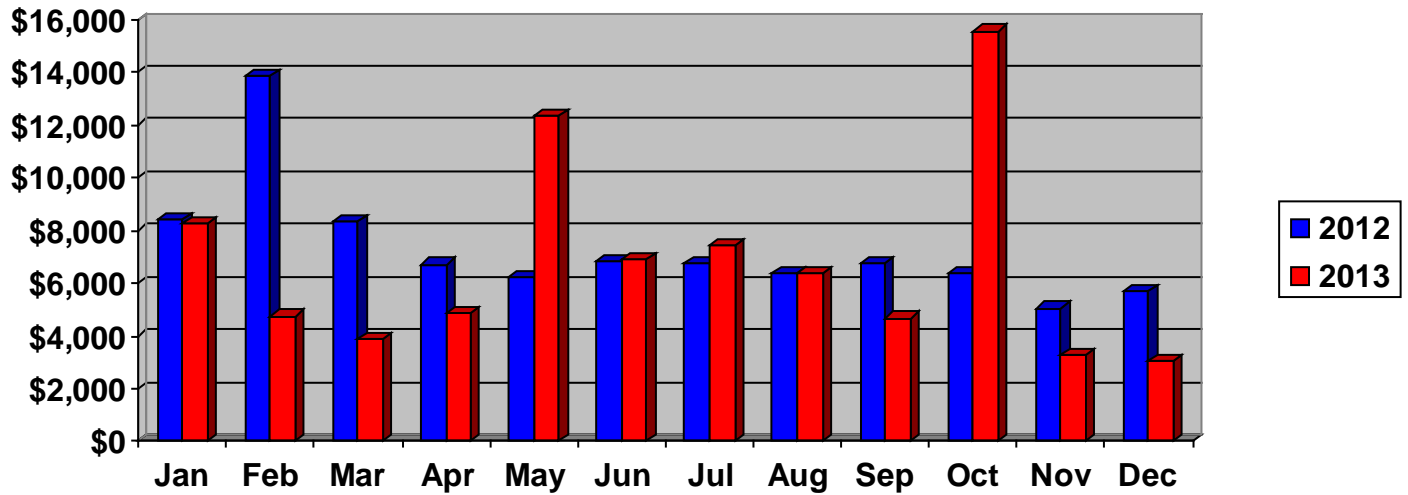

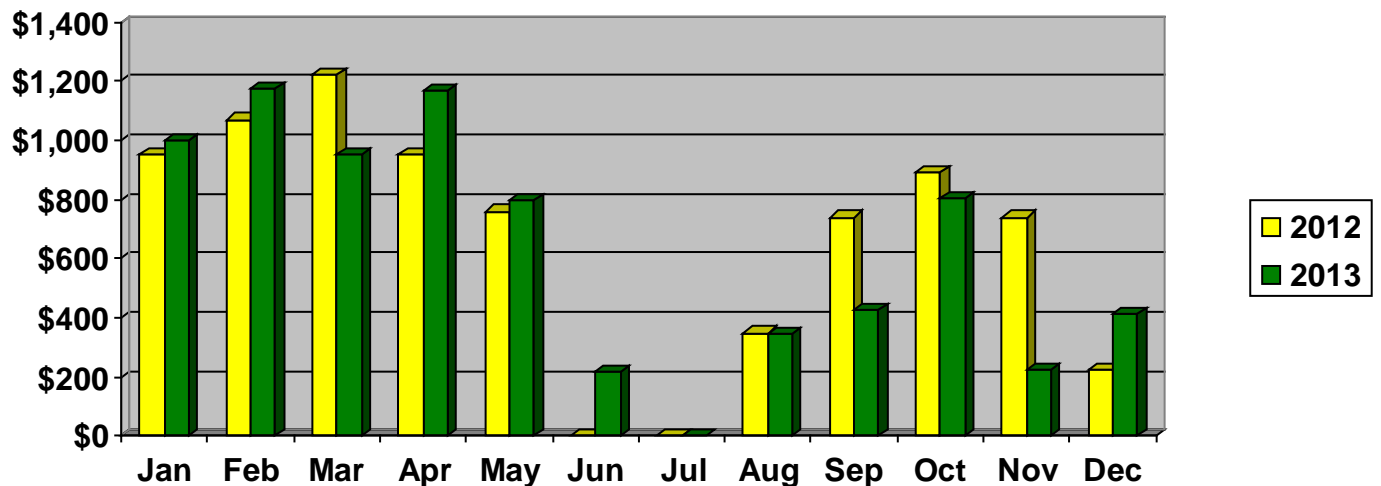
