#### **Executive Summary**

Since 1982, tips coming in over the Crime Stoppers hotline in Tarrant County have resulted in excess of \$3,029,000 in rewards being paid to anonymous tipsters. These tips resulted in the recovery of over \$36,547,000 worth of stolen property and narcotics, 14,447 law breaking individuals being arrested, and 34,732 cases being cleared.

The Crime Stoppers of Tarrant County Program has two operational divisions. Collectively, in 2018 these divisions paid **\$85,760** in rewards. These rewards helped effect the recovery of **\$532,139** in stolen property and narcotics, the arrest of **226** individuals, and the clearing of **616** cases.

#### The Community Program - 2018

Countywide, Crime Stoppers assisted in the recovery of stolen property and narcotics valued at \$531,467. In addition, 195 arrests were made, 328 cases were cleared, and \$73,600 in rewards was paid in 2018.

#### **The Campus Program - 2018**

Rewards for the Campus Crime Stoppers Program totaled \$12,160, with \$672 in stolen property and narcotics being recovered, 31 individuals arrested, 176 administratively disciplined, and 288 cases cleared on Tarrant County middle and high school campuses.

In addition to the traditional Crime Stoppers money rewarded for a particular crime, Crime Stoppers of Tarrant County will add a bonus reward of up to \$250 for tip information leading to an arrest(s) in gun and/or gang-related crimes in Tarrant County. The program aims at breaking down a code of silence that often exists among gangs and people who witness gang-related or gun-related crimes.




#### **COMMUNITY PROGRAM REWARDS 2017/2018 COMPARISON**

#### 2018 Success Stories

#### Arlington Police Department Success Stories

- In January 2018, information from a Crime Stoppers of Tarrant County mobile app tip assisted Arlington officers in an investigation that led to two (2) arrests for Manufacture/Delivery Controlled Substance 4-200g, the seizure of \$5,850 worth of meth and cocaine, a recovery of a 1999 Mercury valued at \$2,000.
- ❖ In February 2018, information from a Crime Stoppers of Tarrant County mobile app tip assisted Arlington officers in an investigation that led to two (2) arrests for Possession Marijuana 4oz-5lbs and Possession of Marijuana <2oz. A CZ Scorpion Assault Rifle worth \$900, \$575 worth of Marijuana, and \$4,865 in cash were seized. In addition to receiving a Crime Stoppers reward, the tipster also received a Gun & Gang Busters bonus reward.
- In May 2018, information from a Crime Stoppers of Tarrant County mobile app tip assisted Arlington officers in an investigation that led to an arrest for Possession Marijuana 4oz-5lbs, Possession Controlled Substance 4-200g, Possession Controlled Substance 1-4g, and Delivery of Marijuana 1/4oz-5lbs. The arrest included the seizure of \$8,848 worth of Marijuana, THC, and Meth.
- ❖ In July 2018, information from a Crime Stoppers of Tarrant County mobile app tip assisted Arlington officers in an investigation that led to four (4) arrests for Parole Violation-Possession Controlled Substance, Misdemeanors x5, and Possession Controlled Substance x2, the seizure of \$232 worth of Heroin, Meth, Marijuana, and Psilocybin, two (2) guns Colt .38 Special and North American Arms .22 worth \$400, and \$647 in cash. In addition to receiving a Crime Stoppers reward, the tipster also received a Gun & Gang Busters bonus reward.

#### Fort Worth Police Department Success Stories

- ❖ In January 2018, Crime Stoppers of Tarrant County received a tip regarding a homicide tip that was sent to the FWPD Fugitive Unit. Using this tip information, officers tracked the fugitive by his cell phone to his whereabouts in Dallas. Fugitive was arrested for the following outstanding felony warrants: Murder (x2), Aggravated Kidnapping. In addition to receiving a Crime Stoppers reward, the tipster also received a Gun & Gang Busters bonus reward.
- In January 2018, Crime Stoppers of Tarrant County received a mobile app tip that assisted officers in identifying a suspect that committed multiple burglary offenses where safes were stolen from businesses. The suspect was taken into custody and arrested on the following charges: Burglary of a Building, Burglary of Habitation, 2x- Credit Card Abuse.
- ❖ In February 2018, Crime Stoppers of Tarrant County received a tip on a Fort Worth fugitive located Tulsa, Oklahoma. Information was forwarded to U.S. Marshals Northern Oklahoma Task Force which led to the fugitive's arrest for: Aggravated Robbery Deadly Weapon Serious Bodily Injury, Possession Firearm by Felon, and Making Firearm Accessible to a Child.
- In March 2018, Crime Stoppers of Tarrant County received a narcotics tip which resulted in three (3) felony and misdemeanor arrests for Possession of Controlled Substance 4-40g, Possession of Marijuana 4oz-5lbs, Weapon Possession, and local outstanding warrants. Seizures included \$5,520 in cash, a 45cal semi-auto pistol, an AR-15 semi-auto rifle, and \$2,613 worth of marijuana, Xanax, and Ecstasy. In addition to receiving a Crime Stoppers reward, the tipster also received a Gun & Gang Busters bonus reward.
- In April 2018, Crime Stoppers of Tarrant County received a mobile app tip regarding a mentally ill person that had been posting online "kill as many people as possible" and indicated that he owned firearms. The suspect was identified by police and could have been a danger to innocent citizens. The suspect had a rifle and hand gun in his possession when he was taken into custody. The suspect was placed in JPS Hospital on a mental application. An AR-15 semi-auto rifle with two (2) mags and 5.56 ammo, a Glock 43 semi-auto pistol with two (2) mags and 9mm ammo were confiscated from the suspect. In addition to receiving a Crime Stoppers reward, the tipster also received a Gun & Gang Busters bonus reward.

- In May 2018, Crime Stoppers of Tarrant County received a narcotics tip that led officers to conduct surveillance at the tip location, where they observed a dope deal, then the suspect vehicle left the location. Officers stopped the suspect vehicle, searched it, and dope was found and the suspect arrested. The suspect was arrested for Possession Marijuana <2oz, Possession Controlled Substance PG2 4-400g, Possession Controlled Substance PG1 1-4g, and Possession Marijuana 4oz-5lbs. Drugs seized included: Marijuana worth \$824, Cocaine-Powder worth \$116, and THC Oil worth \$9,468.</p>
- ❖ In June 2018, Crime Stoppers of Tarrant County received a narcotics tip through the Crime Stoppers Call Center hotline. Officers conducted surveillance and observed the suspect leave the tip location. Officers conducted a felony traffic stop on the stolen suspect vehicle. The vehicle was recovered and the suspect was arrested on the following charges: Manufacture/Delivery Controlled Substance PG1 4-200g x2, Manufacture/Delivery Controlled Substance PG2 <4g, Manufacture/Delivery Controlled Substance PG1 1-4g, Manufacture/Delivery Controlled Substance PG3 4-200g, Manufacture/Delivery Controlled Substance PG2 <1g, and Possession Marijuana 2-4oz. Drugs seized included the following: GHB worth \$11,016, THC worth \$9,102, Meth-Ice worth \$1,091, Black Tar Heroin worth \$236 Xanax worth \$3,502, Marijuana worth \$330, and Mushrooms worth \$182. The recovered stolen vehicle was a Uhaul Ford Box Truck.</p>
- ❖ In June 2018, Crime Stoppers of Tarrant County received a tip on the homicide at the OK Food Mart. Officers located the suspect at the tip location. The suspect was arrested at the tip location for outstanding felony warrant: Murder. In addition to receiving a Crime Stoppers reward, the tipster also received a Gun & Gang Busters bonus reward.
- ❖ In June 2018, Crime Stoppers of Tarrant County received a mobile app narcotics tip that results in the following drugs seized: Prescription worth \$980, Xanax worth \$11,186, Marijuana worth \$1,809, Ecstasy worth \$1,548, and Cocaine-Crack worth \$2,400. The suspect was arrested for Probation Violation-Felony, Manufacture/Delivery Controlled Substance PG2 1-4g, Unlawful Possession of Firearm by Felon, Manufacture/Delivery Controlled Substance PG3 <4g, Theft Firearm, and a local Class C warrant. \$1,796 in cash was also seized.</p>
- ❖ In June 2018, Crime Stoppers of Tarrant County received a mobile app tip that led officers to a narcotics arrest for Possession Marijuana 4oz-5lbs, Possession Controlled Substance PG2 <400g, Unlawful Possession Firearm by Felon, and Possession Controlled Substance PG1 <1g and included the seizure of \$4,912 in cash, a Sig Sauer P228 9mm Semi-Auto Pistol worth \$500, Marijuana worth \$2,400, THC Oil worth \$40,581, and Meth-Ice worth \$160. In addition to receiving a Crime Stoppers reward, the tipster also received a Gun & Gang Busters bonus reward.</p>
- ❖ In August 2018, Crime Stoppers of Tarrant County received a tip that led the Tarrant Regional Auto Crimes Task Force to identifying three (3) suspects related to a ring of Auto Thefts and Engaging in Organized Crime offenses. All three (3) suspects were arrested and several trailers and motorcycles were recovered including a black flatbed trailer worth \$2,500, a Pace cargo trailer worth \$3,500, a 2016 Harley Davidson motorcycle worth \$1,600, a 2006 Honda motorcycle worth \$2,200, and a 2006 Harley Davidson motorcycle worth \$500. The suspects were Tango Blast gang members. In addition to receiving a Crime Stoppers reward, the tipster also received a Gun & Gang Busters bonus reward.
- ❖ In September 2018, Crime Stoppers of Tarrant County received a narcotics tip that resulted in the following seized: Heroin worth \$440, Marijuana worth \$5, \$1,093 in cash, five (5) digital scales, a LG Cell Phone and seven (7) guns valued at \$2,200. The guns seized included: a Springfield XP 9mm Semi-Auto Pistol worth \$500, a Mossberg Maverick 12ga shotgun worth \$250, a Ruger Ranch Rifle 223cal Semi-Auto worth \$500, a HiPoint .380cal Semi-Auto Pistol worth \$200, a Ruger P95 9mm Semi-Auto Pistol worth \$350, a Sport Arms 22cal Revolver Pistol worth \$150, and a Taurus 38sp revolver pistol worth \$250. Two arrests were made for Possession Controlled Substance PG1 4-20g and Unlawful Possession Firearm Felon x2. In addition to receiving a Crime Stoppers reward, the tipster also received a Gun & Gang Busters bonus reward.
- ❖ In October 2018, Crime Stoppers of Tarrant County received a narcotics tip that resulted in the following drug seizures: Meth-Ice worth \$60, Heroin worth \$24, Promethazine worth \$53,000, and a small amount of Cocaine-Crack. Three (3) arrests were made for Possession Controlled Substance PG1 <1g, Possession Marijuana <2oz, and local Class C warrants.</p>
